



The 2012-2015 Zimbabwe United Nations Development Assistance Framework (ZUNDAF) is the UN's development programme support to national development priorities as well as the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by 2015.

The ZUNDAF is designed at a strategic level to provide the Government of Zimbabwe and the UN Country Team (UNCT) with a flexible and agile framework, incorporating principles of recovery and development in seven National Development Priority areas listed below.

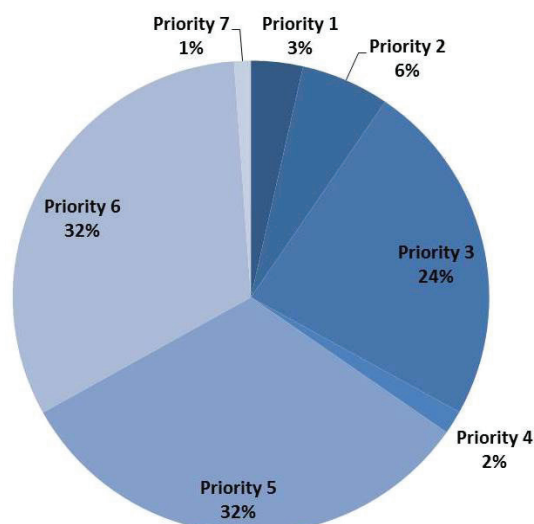

2012 - 2015 ZUNDAF Implementation

The 2012-2015 ZUNDAF is implemented in partnership with the Government of Zimbabwe and with strong support from Development Partners.

To effectively translate the ZUNDAF Priority Areas into concrete results, a Joint Implementation Matrix (JIM) and a series of Flagship Programmes, were developed.

In going forward, and as demonstrated at the 2013 ZUNDAF High Level Annual Review, the current ZUNDAF remains substantively aligned to the 2013-2018 Zimbabwe Agenda for Sustainable Socio-Economic Transformation (Zim Asset).

ZUNDAF Partnerships

The implementation of the ZUNDAF requires the establishment of solid partnerships which are consistent with national priorities.

Partnerships with donors, the private sector, and civil society are critical to leveraging all the interests, knowledge and resources necessary to achieve collective results.

During the two years (2012 & 2013) of the ZUNDAF implementation, the United Nations, with the generous support of donors, delivered USD 798.4 million in grants supporting national development priorities.

Disaster Risk Reduction, Prevention and Response

In response to the general improvement of the humanitarian situation in Zimbabwe, the Government, the UN and humanitarian partners have scaled down humanitarian work. As such, there is no coordinated humanitarian appeal process for 2014.

Partners continue to support the Department of Civil Protection, the Government body responsible for disaster risk reduction to respond to emergencies as they arise, while building resilience to help communities better cope with disasters.

2016 - 2020 ZUNDAF Development

As part of the UN's engagement beyond 2015, the UN and the Government are currently rolling out the 2016-2020 ZUNDAF.

Key issues in the rollout roadmap include data collection, evaluation, country analysis and strategic prioritisation.

The 2016-2020 ZUNDAF will be directly informed by the Zim Asset and address emerging development issues from the ongoing Post - 2015 Development Agenda processes.
